

Pupils should build on their previous knowledge and skills through performing, composing and listening. They should develop their vocal and/or instrumental fluency, accuracy and expressiveness; and understand musical structures, styles, genres and traditions, identifying the expressive use of musical dimensions. They should listen with increasing discrimination and awareness to inform their practice as musicians. They should use technologies appropriately and appreciate and understand a wide range of musical contexts and styles.



CURRICULUM

Our four live music roadshows will supplement your music curriculum. Each show last approximately 40-minutes. The pupils will be treated to a professional musical experience where they will also learn about styles, genres and musical instrument development. The four roadshows are:

- Percussion usually delivered in terms 2 & 3.
- Rock & Pop usually delivered in terms 4 & 6.
- String usually delivered in term 4.
- Wind usually delivered in term 6.

As an alternative, we now offer prerecorded video Roadshows. This approach allows your school to play the recordings in each classroom. The recordings will be offered to your school for a full term.

Each school/setting receives 6 x 30minute sessions delivered in your school/setting by a music service early years specialist.


First Steps:

What is the Make a Noise Festival?

This is an annual festival that runs over a two-week period. After your teachers/practitioners have learnt the songs and received a resource pack at the **First Steps** CPD sesson, they will coach their children in readiness for them to join together with other schools and settings. At this festival the young children will experience their first public performance in an informal setting under the direction of the music service early years specialist. Parents and family members will be able to attend and witness their child's very first music performance in public.

Singing in school

Singing is a unique form of self-expression accessible to all. It promotes self-esteem and emotional well-being, and is a fundamental means of communication. Singing together builds a sense of community, and it is evident in most cultures, celebrations and key moments of life. It is an important part of early learning and development, and is the natural starting point for music-making.

We believe that by providing a comprehensive singing programme in your school we can support your staff in delivering a valuable musical experience for your pupils.

Voice Festivals

Our annual Voice Music Festivals include CPD for school staff and entry in to the Festival for your pupils

- Infant Voice Festival (usually in July of each Year with the **INSET** in April).
- Junior Voice Festival (usually March of each year with the **INSET** in January).
- Christmas Voice Festival (usually November of each year with the I**NSET** in September).

Your school will receive a log-in to the songs, lyrics and backing & vocal tracks.

IN2MUSIC is a 15-WEEK programme, spread over 3-terms of a 6-term academic year to introduce young children to instrumental learning. It is designed to be taught by a specialist music service tutor alongside a class teacher or teacher assistant.

High-quality instrumental and vocal lessons for individuals

We offer your pupils the chance to learn woodwind, brass, strings, guitar, ukulele, percussion, drums, vocal, keyboard and piano with our experienced and inspiring tutors.

Our approach is **broad and inclusive** and we aim to **inspire a lifelong love of music.** Our lessons integrate with and support the National Curriculum and contribute to the wider culture of the school.

Financial Support may be available

The **Parent Direct Pay** scheme may attract entry into our **REMISSION** programme. We do encourage your school to communicate this offer to parents as early as possible at the start of the academic year. This is because a budget is set at the beginning of the year and once used, the programme will close until the following year.

Parent Direct Pay Criteria

The following categories (where schools are hosting lessons) attract remission:

- Pupils in year groups reception to year 11 recorded as Ever 6 service child or in receipt of a child pension from the Ministry of Defence.
- Pupils categorised as SEND.
- Looked-after children (LAC) defined in the Children Act 1989 as one who is in the care of, or provided with accommodation by an English local authority
- Children who have ceased to be looked after by a local authority in England and Wales because of adoption, a special guardianship order, or child arrangements order (previously known as a residence order)
- LAC reduction of fees for first choice lessons. Pupils also get free attendance at Swindon Young Musicians club as a part of this agreement:

All categories listed above can receive a reduction of fees for first choice lessons:

- 20 minute individual lessons: 60% discount on the fees.
- Instrument hire costs: 60% discount

Remissions only apply to lessons on one instrument per child

LAC children & children under a Special Guardianship Orders have the opportunity to take up free membership of SYM

Inclusion is a one-term (5-session) programme to introduce young children to music learning. It is designed to be taught by a specialist music service tutor alongside a class teacher or teacher assistant.

What the school will get:

Swindon Music Service offers schools the opportunity to book a visiting music specialist to work with small groups of SEN children. These sessions are highly subsidised and due to popularity are usually limited to five sessions of 45 minutes per year, per school. They are very much 'hands-on', practical sessions tailored to the needs of your group. This opportunity is not limited to specials schools. It is also available to schools that have an SEND unit or identified group of SEND children within school.

Arts Award Discover in a Day is an introductory award open to children and young people aged up to 25. This award provides a great introduction to the arts.

To achieve Discover, children and young people discover the arts around them, find out about the artists and their work and share their experiences with others, gaining a certificate at the end. Arts award Discover in a Day can be delivered at your school or at the Music Service's home: The Platform.

Through Arts Award young people gain a nationally recognised qualification enabling them to progress into further education and employment. Children and young people work with an Arts Awards Advisor (SMS has advisors) who supports young people in gaining arts experiences, provides guidance and assesses arts logs and portfolios.
