MAKE MUSIC TOGETHER

The Class Band is a modern, motivating and effective way of teaching music. The pupils systematically learn to play on a wind instrument. Theory is taught in a playful way and the pupils remember it much better. The pupils together form an orchestra right from the start. The children can start in the Class Band without any prior knowledge.

The Class Band is in principle a two-year music course which can then continue as a school orchestra, Big Band or Symphonic Wind Orchestra.

Possible organizational forms of a Class Band:

- In the school: in the classroom during school hours for everyone
- In the music society as a forerunner of the youth orchestra
- At the music school as an orchestra for all students

Advantages of participating in a Class Band:

- Promoting motivation and self-awareness

- Developing team spirit and a sense of responsibility in a group
- Increase of the concentration
- Being responsible fora valuable instrument
- Joint concerts

Advantages of starting a Class Band:

- All the learning objectives of established curricula are taught in practice.
- Learning an instrument goes hand in hand with learning in a playful way from other musical subjects such as history and basic knowledge.
- Regularly playing together in a class orchestra promotes conscious and multidimensional learning.

SEMINARS AND TRAINING

You can't just give a Class Band - that's why we organise seminars and training courses for teachers who want to start the Class Band and seminars for teachers who are already experienced. Even after the start of a Class Band, we will continue to offer guidance. In this way not only the children learn with each other and from each other, but also the teachers!

About the content of the seminar: the following matters will be discussed:

- Knowledge of all instruments used in the Class Band including transpositions
- The ability to play at least five notes on each instrument.
- Group processes and didactic skills
- Going through the book Essential Elements teacher's book/partition and pupil's books and getting to know the pieces.
- Practical tips on the first lessons: appointments with the students, skills such as unpacking/packing, cleaning, etc.
- Practicing in real with other participants
- Preparing learning situations from a certain starting point
- self-composing polyphonic pieces with a five-tone scale
- and much more!

It is possible to organise a seminar 'on demand' of one day to ensure that the participants can start. A second seminar is then desirable. It may also be sufficient for the seminar teacher to visit a Class Band and then conduct an evaluation and give any necessary tips. During the seminar everything can be discussed according to the needs of the participants and the seminar teacher.





MUSIC EDUCATION WITH

ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS

It takes a lot of knowledge to learn to play an instrument - at the same time - together in the classroom. The Essential Elements method was developed especially for this purpose in America and adapted for the European countries and translated into German, Dutch and French. Of course, the English books can also be used. The method contains lots for each instrument and a score/teacher's handbook for the teacher. There are CD's available to play along with.

The education is structured in such a way that the students learn their instrument in small steps. Extensions can be easily integrated. It is also possible to offer differentiated education in which the fast and the slow student are stimulated and challenged in order to be able to continue to follow the learning pace in the group.

The most important pedagogical content of the method:

- simple start with a five-tone scale
- clear preparation of theoretica! knowledge and content
- Learning Goal (ontrol: The Essential Elements Quiz
- Motivate attractive pieces to play even in unisone games
- clear layout of new learning objectives
- systematic use of rhythmic models
- daily rehearsal exercises in increasing difficulty
- etudes for tone formation, technique, rhythm and ensemble playing (sound)
- separate pages on the history of the instruments
- tips on maintenance, tone formation and use
- polyphonic arranged pieces ascending in difficulty
- systematic practice of the change of register in the clarinet by means of special exercises
- Interesting batches for percussion: mallet batches included
- scale exercises according to Rubank (c), rhythm exercises
- Introduction to creative use of music: improvisation and composition
- piano accompaniment with good sounding and varied harmonization

There are also digital applications such as the books as eBook on the iPad and website based software such as Essential Elements Interactive.



The music teacher/conductor is the 'boss' of the orchestra and decides on all learning objectives in orchestral education. Instrumental education is best given by teachers in close cooperation with the conductor.

Music teachers (whether from the music school or private or from the music society) are the most important partners of the Class Band. With a good targeted lesson on the instruments, the Class Band can function in optimized way.

Instrumental education in the Class Band requires a great deal of adaptability on the part of the music teachers. Instrumental education is given in the group and is based on the system of brass instruments. This means most of the music in the first year is in Bflat. Flutes and Oboes has to adapt to this key. Which is not impossible but doable as we know since many years.

One of the most important tasks of the music teacher is to advise and observe the pupils du ring the choice of their instrument.

The instrumental teachers ensure that the orchestral lessons can take place properly and that the conductor does not have to concern himself as much as possible with grips, fingering and posture.

Of course, this also depends on the number of hours that the students can take lessons per week. If there is only one hour, the teacher can take a group out of the rehearsal during the orchestra and teach them separately.

There are many possibilities and you can always rely on our help and ideas.







The Class Band follows the scoring of the symphonic wind orchestra with a good balance between woodwind and brass instruments. When choosing the instrument that the student will play his or her

whole time in the Class Band, the students must be well accompanied by a teacher.

In the Class Band we use the following instruments in an average instrumentation:

5 flutes

6 clarinets

4 saxophones

4 trumpets

2 horns

4 trombones

2 euphoniums

1 tuba

If one chooses to use percussion as well, this should be done from the very beginning and as a fixed part of the teaching concept.

Percussion is a real part of the symphonic wind orchestra and must have students who can also play melodie percussion and timpani.





OTHER INSTRUMENTS


The method also provides for the use of other instruments in the Class Band:

- Oboe
- Bassoon
- Bass clarinet
- Tenor saxophone
- Baritone saxophone
- E-bass
- Piano

The use of these instruments in the Class Band has some consequences for the conductor and the rehearsals of the orchestra. Some instruments such as oboe and tenor saxophone can of course be added from the very beginning, provided that a number of conditions are met: for example, an oboe must have a doublereed player in front of the orchestra and a tenor sax (or soprano sax) must have a student who can handle this. The sound of the orchestra will change for the better with the addition of (some of) these instruments and it is a whole new challenge for the teacher and the students.

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In a first Class Band it is not advisable to start with these instruments right away. However, these instruments are important for a continuation of the Class Band at a later stage as a symphonic wind orchestra. During the lessons the teacher can present these instruments and thus arouse the interest of the students. A tenor saxophone, for example, can also be an extra challenge for the student who no longer sees a challenge on an alto saxophone ..

CLASS BAND FOR ADULTS AND SENIORS

A Class Band is not only suitable for use at a school but can also be used within the music society as an alternative to the youth orchestra. Particularly important is the tact that within the Class Band the students learn to play simultaneously and in an orchestral setting. This is attractive for the students and the music society can attract many more new members. In addition, it is also possible to have different ages mixed up. The Essential Elements method can simply be followed and here. too. teachers trom the association or possibly the music school can be involved in the group lessons for each instrument..

After the Class Band, the students can then move on to the youth orchestra and develop themselves further within the association.

In the meantime, a number of adult and senior Class Bands have started in Europe! Sometimes it is the parents of children in the Class Band who want to play and sometimes retired people with time (and money).

Regardless of age: anyone can learn to play an instrument! And also for adults: learning to play together in a group is much more fun and motivating than alone. The social aspect also plays an important role. The Class Band is also a place where people can meet each other.

DIGITAL TOOLS WITH

ESSENTIAL ELEMENTS

Essential Elements offers some digital tools for the Class Band. First of all, the books are available in English as an eBook for the iPad in which the content is

exactly the same, but with the addition of all the accompaniments for each piece of music can be called up immediately with a simple click to the piece. The video instruction films can also be seen directly in the book.

There are schools where the students have an iPad for teaching purposes and they can immediately take lessons in the Class Band with the iPad.

In addition, the English-language books have a specific code that gives access to

'Essential Elements Interactive', a web-based software program for teachers and students. This is very extensive: you can choose different accompaniments to the pieces in different styles and you can record your own play. The teacher can follow this and enter homework via the system. There is also a complete administrative tool in which one can keep track of the students. Name, instrument, serial number, progress, etc. A student tracking system. Students can study at home and let themselves be guided by the computer. The different accompaniment styles such as pop, jazz, classical, country, gospel, etc. teach the students to recognize different styles immediately.




